Free Preschool! Free Preschool! Free Preschool!

Are you interested in registering your child for the 2016-2017 State-Wide Voluntary Preschool Program? Here's the Information you'll need.

- You do not need to attend your home-school for preschool. Preschool does not follow district home-school boundaries. All district preschool classrooms fill on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Use the following link to view all of the sites that offer SWVPP free preschool for fours: http://www.dbgschools.org/parents/registration/preschool/
- There are just two requirements for this free preschool programming:
 - 1. Your child must be four by September 15, 2016. You must provide proof-of-age upon registration, so please bring a birth-certificate, passport, or a signed immunization record as proof-of-age.
 - 2. Your family must reside in the state of Iowa.
- Dubuque Community School District Elementary Schools will begin accepting preschool registrations beginning Monday, February 1, 2016.
- Please register at the school office of your choice of elementary schools except for Hoover as Hoover does not offer preschool at this time.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Your child may not attend free preschool for two years.
- Your child may not attend free preschool if they are five on or before September 15, 2016. Make sure that you take advantage of free SWVPP during your child's fourth year!
- The birthdate range that qualifies for free SWVPP is <u>September 16, 2011</u> through <u>September 15, 2012</u>. Sometimes this is helpful to have at-theready as it gets confusing.
- Any district preschool slots remaining after August 1, 2016 will be available for tuition-paying five-year-olds. Tuition for the 2015-2016 school year was \$358 per month for Dubuque Community School District classrooms.

^{*}Please be advised that the State Legislature of Iowa may consider proposals that could reduce or eliminate funding for this preschool program at any time.
